Dear Quartet Champ,

his year's Mid-Atlantic District Fall Convention was again held in Reading, PA on October 5-7 at the Santander Performing Arts Center. Our 20th annual quartet champ's association reunion and performance on the Saturday Night Show of Champions was fantastic, as usual. Attending the convention were 41 champs representing 37 foursomes spanning 6 decades ... from the Out-of-**Towners** (1960) to **Gimme Four** (2018).

First, to the end with the quartet results:

Our 2019 Mid-Atlantic District Quartet Champions ... MIDTOWN

Anthony Fortino (L), Christian Diaz (Bs), KJ McAleesejergens (Br), and Nick Gordon (T). (Hell's Kitchen, NY and Kansas City, MO.)

They sang "Birth of the Blues", "What Do I Need with Love", "Death of a Bachelor", and "Never Give **All the Heart**" to earn a score of 2,024 (84.3%) and were 1st in both rounds and all three categories. The quartet is now the 74th champion since 1945 for a total of 229 men to have earned this high distinction. All four men are new to our close fraternity. CONGRATULATIONS and welcome, Fellas!

The Presenter for the Friday Quartet Semifinals was our own Fred Womer.

- ♣ The MADAQC Chorus met on Friday evening after the quartet session for a quick rehearsal in an echo chamber that made us sound like 50 men. Kevin King ran us through our paces.
- ➡ Terry Reynolds was the Presenter for the chorus competition which had a very early start for many and was an incredibly busy day for 11 champs who were the Directors of competing choruses. Competing MADAQC member chorus directors included: Joe Servidio, Jr. for the Dapper Dans of Harmony, Richard Lewellen for the Fairfax Jubilaires, Jeff Glemboski for the Long Island Sound, Kevin King for the Chorus of the Chesapeake, Larry Bomback for the Voices of Gotham, Rich Gray, Jr. for The Pine Barons, Jay Butterfield for Parkside Harmony, Mike Wallen for the Virginians, TJ Barranger for the Sons of the Severn, and David Ammirata and Will Downey for East Coast Sound.

There were two Mic Coolers this year: the **Bella NOVA Chorus** from Harmony Inc. directed by **Richard Lewellen** and who are going the HI International Contest this November 1 in Orlando, FL and sang for the judge's evaluation only, and the

Wildcat Harmonizers directed by **John Wernega** who are headed to Mid-Winter Convention in January and were here to fundraise for their trip.

♣ After the chorus contest, Ron Knickerbocker assisted by Rich Gray, Jr. gave out Chorus Directors Service Recognition Awards to front-line directors of 10 years or more (in 5-year increments). Seven men were recognized including our own Bill Colosimo who received his 30-year award. Kevin King then presented a







very special "Fred King Award" to Glenn Williamson for his 35 years of service.

- ♣ And speaking of chorus directors, it is also well worth noting that two amazing ladies whom we all know as terrific performers and quartet coaches also directed top-level choruses: Anne Bureau led The North Pennsmen to a 4th place tied finish, and Stephanie Brictson led The Country Gentlemen to a 10th place finish and earning Most Improved Chorus honors.
- **♣** The **Barbershopper of the Year Awards** followed and were given to 13 recipients.



➡ Mid-Atlantic District Hall of Honor members (many of whom are quartet champs) were invited to the stage for the induction ceremony for this year's recipients of the District's highest award. Jay Butterfield read the criteria and short biographies after which the recipients were presented with commemorative engraved silver plates and HoH name badges. The distinguished honorees were Robert Eckman and Roger Heer who are also both DELA members. Each man received a well-deserved standing ovation from the audience for their lifetime of service and contribution to barbershopping in our great District.



♣ Dick Powell (2019 BHS President) and Rob Arnold (Panel Administrator) announced the results. The 2019 Mid-Atlantic District Chorus Champions ... Parkside Harmony under the codirection of Sean Devine and Jay Butterfield. They staged 51 men and scored 1,120 (93.3%) and sang "American Tune" and "If I Can Dream". This was Parkside's 3rd consecutive District Chorus Championship. They earned a 3rd Place medal in the 2018 International Chorus Competition this past summer in Orlando, FL, but will not be going to the 2019 competition next summer.

2nd Place – Voices of Gotham (Hell's Kitchen, NY) under the direction of **Larry Bomback** staged 38 men and earned a score of 1,020 (85.0%). They are the M-AD qualifying chorus for the BHS International Chorus Contest in Salt Lake City, UT next July.



3rd Place – East Coast Sound (Caldwell, NJ) under the co-direction of David Ammirata and Will Downey staged 19 men and earned a score of 961 (80.1%)

Filling out the Top-5 choruses were **The North Pennsmen** (Lansdale, PA) who tied for 4th staging 38 men earning a score of 872 (72.7%), and **The Virginians** (Richmond, VA) who tied for 4th staging 47 men and also earned a score of 872 (72.7%).

- Immediately following the chorus competition, **Ross Trube** again coordinated the ever-popular **Tag with the Champs** event in the Santander lobby to support the District's **Youth in Harmony** program. **Gimme Four** was the featured champ. The event was fun and generated a lot of enthusiasm ... and over \$500 for a great cause. Thanks to all.
- The MADAQC Chorus gathered at 8:30 pm on Saturday evening to rehearse under the steady hands of **Kevin King**. Once again there was some confusion about our rehearsal space, but we hope to work that out next year. Still, everyone was well-prepared, so it did not take long until we were ready.
- ♣ The Presenter for the Saturday Night Show of Champions was our own Steve Kirsch. The show kicked off with a performance by the 2018 M-AD Champs, Gimme Four, who gave a highly-entertaining set bringing to close a great

championship year. Thanks, and keep up the good work, fellas! You have shown yourselves to be true champions, especially with your volunteer support, chorus directing, coaching, and other team contributions to the District.





Following that, the Top-3 finishing choruses performed. Parkside Harmony was awarded their trophy (well, actually it was still on a table in the lobby) and **Sean Devine** and **Jay Butterfield** offered a few heartfelt words of appreciation to the District. They then gave an amazing performance of "Bridge Over Troubled Water" that featured soloists **Alex Corson** and **Pratt Street Power**. Just awesome!







Steve White emceed the **MADAQC** finale segment. The curtain opened on the **MADAQC Chorus** who were standing proud on the risers. He commented on the 41 men at the convention representing 37 championship quartets and read the list of quartet names while the audience gave a rousing clap for each. He then recognized our 2 International Quartet Champions present this weekend, **Ron Knickerbocker** (1974-Regents) and Jack Pinto (2011-Old School).



Steve then highlighted the induction of our **1955 M-AD Champs**, the **Easternaires**, into the **BHS Hall of Fame Class of 2018**. Six specific members of the quartet (of 12 overall during their 30 years together) were honored: **Danny Heyburn**, **Tommy Dames**, **Bob Bohn**, **Bill Annichiarico**, **Dave Middlestadt**, and **Eddy Ryan** who was in Orlando to accept the award on behalf of his pals along with family of the other quartet members.

It was the **25**th **anniversary** of our **1994 M-AD Champs**, the **Bingo Brothers** with **Fred Womer** (L), **Gary Parker** (Bs), **Dennis Malone** (Br), and **John Casey** (T). Freddie was on the risers with MADAQC to accept the recognition.



It was the landmark **50**th **anniversary** of our **1969 M-AD Champs**, the **Classics** with **Carl Snyder** (L, deceased), **Paul Kline** (Bs), **Jack Malone** (Br), and **Phil Steel** (T). Paul, Jack, and Phil were all there (wearing the original tuxedos they won with) to accept the adulation of the District audience.





THE BIG FINALE:

As the Top-10 quartets huddled back stage, anxiously waiting to hear what could be for each a "momentous moment", **Dick Powell** and **Rob Arnold** announced the results as **Gimme Four** stood at-the-ready to award the lapel pins and congratulate the Top-3 finishers.

Also, in the Top 10 was **Youth Reclamation Project** (w/ **Mike Wallen**) who were winners of the **District Seniors Quartet Contest** and will go to the BHS Mid-Winter Convention in January. **Silver Alert** (w/ **Will Cox** and **Rick Savage**) placed 3rd in the Seniors Contest.

Midtown was then crowned District Quartet Champions and awarded the traveling **MADAQC/Oriole Four Trophy,** individual **James E. Grant Performance Award** trophies (provided annually by **Bob Disney** in memory of Jim and **Arcade**), and blue 2019 1st Place lapel pins.











Kevin King then directed the MADAQC Chorus in singing our traditional song of celebration and congratulations, "*This is the Moment*" (arranged by **Freddie King**), as **Midtown** stood embracing each other – their pride of accomplishment showing proudly.

◆ Dave Ammirata then led the entire audience in "Keep the Whole World Singing" ... bringing to close another fantastic barbershop convention as only the Mid-Atlantic District can do. Every champ then congratulated **Midtown** with handshakes, hugs, and slaps on their backs.



Immediately following the close of the convention, we moved from the stage to the Dasani Lounge of the Santander along with friends and family for a **Quartet Champion's Reception** where **Steve White** congratulated the **Classics** with a toast for their 50th anniversary and welcomed **Midtown** into the fraternity with a toast. The Classics offered some sage advice to the new champs and **Gimme Four** offered congratulations and gave personal legacy gifts. Midtown thanked the District and MADAQC and then entertained everyone with a song. Afterwards we all enjoyed a championship cake and photos were taken. Many guys remained for a while to chat and sing tags before heading off to the afterglows.




