
## **FIRST TAKE**

### **2023 Mid-Atlantic District Quartet Champions**

Reprising their incredible medalist performances from the Charlotte International Contest, First Take sang "The Best Things Happen When You're Dancing" (from "White Christmas"), "Santa Fe" (from "Newsies"), "Not While I'm Around" (from "Sweeney Todd") and "You Didn't Want Me When You Had Me" to earn the highest score ever in M-AD quartet contest history ... 3,178 (88.3%).












#### Now, at the beginning of the weekend ...



At 1:00 on Friday afternoon over a dozen quartet champs and guests met at the Shot & Bottle Restaurant in the historic W.W. Griest Building across Penn Square

from the Marriott Hotel for a Quartet Champions Luncheon coordinated by Steve White. In attendance were Bob Parry, Marion Reagan (wife of the late Larry), Kevin King, Rick Taylor, Bill Colosimo, Mark Paul, Neil Dingle and his son Julian, Nick Gordon, KJ

McAleesejergins, Tom Halley, Mike Kelly, and Steve. There were great conversations, laughs, excellent food, and tasty craft beer. The group was highly excited about our first live M-AD convention in 3 years. Ahh, it felt good to be together



again. The luncheon will have to become a new MADAQC tradition whenever and wherever we gather.

Throughout the afternoon, the Marriott Hotel lobby was bustling with the sounds of people meeting and greeting, checking in, and tag-singing, along with bridal parties for 7 weddings that day. Down the hall in the Convention Center and just across from the ticket registration desk was the MADAQC display table that attracted many folks throughout the weekend who were interested in viewing the slide show of champs from

The auditorium was busy with the stage crew led by **Dennis Ritchey** and the sound, lighting, and video crew led by **Mike Kelly**. Needing a pick-up quartet to initially test the mics and monitor speakers, **Brian Ammerman**, **Jamie Patricia**, **Steve White**, and **Rick Taylor** stepped in to make sure everything was adjusted properly.

### **Quartet Contest Semi-Finals**



The **Friday Quartet Semifinals** started at 5:27 pm sharp with presenter **Branden Lynk**, District VP of Events, getting the small but enthusiastic crowd charged up. Our own **Joe Hunter**, pictured here with other panel members, served as a judge for the presentation category.





Several MADAQC guys volunteered to be Friday and Saturday night quartet escorts and backstage cheerleaders (pictured far right are our two trophy guards). Thanks to **Jay Butterfield** and **Dennis Ritchey** for coordinating this effort which was well received and appreciated by all competitors.

The Quin-Tones (Jacob Lapp, Julian LeFlore, Tommy Hunter, Chris Crawford), BHS 2019 Junior Quartet Champions from Salem County, NJ, served as the mic-testers, setting the tone for the entire weekend. The mic-coolers were scheduled to be Pratt Street Power, however one member had laryngitis so instead we had a put-together quartet playfully called "Throw-Town" – all sporting shiny new Charlotte International medals (2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Place) – with Nick Gordon and KJ McAleesejergins from Midtown and Sean Devine and Michael Skutt from Throwback. They wowed and amused the audience with some great singing and repartee between Sean and KJ about who should speak based on medal colors. Guess who had a gold medal in his pocket.

There were 19 scheduled quartet competitors, but last-minute illness forced a couple of scratches. This was the first M-AD fall contest with non-male singers competing together for a single championship and the quality was extremely high. It was great to see <u>3</u> past champs on the boards in quartets ... **Anthony Colosimo** and **Andrew Havens** in **First Take** and **Jeff Glemboski** in **Quatrain**.

#### **Chorus Contest**



The Chorus contest started promptly at 9:27 am. Sheryl Berlin, M-AD Board Member, served as the presenter. The mic-tester chorus were the Sirens of Gotham. There were 17 choruses competing this year, 7 of which were directed by MADAQC members: Vince Sandroni (Parkside Harmony), Will Downey (East Coast Sound), Rich Gray, Jr. (The Pine Barons), Jeff Glemboski (Long Island Sound), Mike Wallen (The Virginians), Joe Servidio, Jr. (The Dapper Dans of Harmony), and Neil "Pookie" Dingle (Keystone Capital Chorus). While the choruses were smaller the quality remained high, and several groups exceeded their scores from 2019.

While we waited for the contest results the Mid-Atlantic District Hall of Honor (HoH) members present at the convention lined up on the stage for the induction ceremony for the district's highest and more prestigious award. Note that 23 individual quartet champs have been inducted into the M-AD HoH since it was established in 1986.



**Rick Taylor**, the 2023 HOH Selection Committee Chair, recognized the two recipients from 2022, **Anne Bureau** and **Joe Cerutti, Jr.**, who were never publicly acknowledged due to the pandemic. He then read the lengthy biography and contributions by the 2023 recipient, **Stephanie Brictson**, who was joined by her proud father **Chuck Lower** (HoH Class of 2003). Each recipient came to the stage separately to accept their engraved silver plates, recognition badges, rousing acknowledgements from the HoH members, and standing ovations by the district audience. Then came the announcement of chorus results ...

Your 2023 Mid-Atlantic District Chorus Champions ... PARKSIDE HARMONY!!!



1<sup>st</sup> Place – Parkside Harmony (Hershey, PA)

Under the co-direction of **Sean Devine** and **Vince Sandroni**, they staged 38, sang "If All My Dreams Were Made of Gold, I'd Buy the World for You" and "I'm Alright" (from "Caddy Shack"), and scored 1,601 points (88.3%). Parkside will represent the M-AD at the 2023 International Chorus Competition in Louisville, KY next summer.





2<sup>nd</sup> Place – East Coast Sound (Caldwell, NJ)

Under the direction of **Will Downey**, they staged 20, earned a score of 1,460 (81.2%) and will represent the M-AD in Louisville.



3<sup>rd</sup> Place – Parkside Melody (Hershey, PA)

Under the co-direction of **Katie MacDonald** and **Melody Hine**, they staged 21, earned a score of 1,445 (80.3%) and will represent the M-AD in Louisville.

Filling out the Top-5 choruses were **Voices of Gotham** (Hell's Kitchen, NY) placing 4<sup>th</sup> with 20 people and earning a score of 1,410 (78.3%) and **The Pine Barons** (Cherry Hill, NJ) placing 5<sup>th</sup> with 43 people and earning a score of 1,409 (78.3%).

### **Late Saturday Afternoon**

Immediately following the chorus competition in the lobby of the Marriott, **Donna** and **Tom Halley** coordinated the ever-popular **Tag with the Champs** event (formerly known as "Dog Tags"). **Ross Trube** who managed this for several years was on hand to offer his support. **Pratt Street Power** and **Gimme Four** were the featured champ quartets who helped generate a lot of enthusiasm, a big crowd (including non-barbershop guests of the hotel), and about \$300 for the district's **Youth in Harmony Program**. Some great younger voices stepped to the microphone to sing entire quartet songs and sounded like champs themselves. Thanks to all who participated and kudos to the Halley's.

The Alexandria Harmonizers, East Coast Sound, and Voices of Gotham participated as the practice choruses with some great new directors honing their skills. Following that, the Alexandria Harmonizers also held an hour-long Master Class on the main auditorium stage.

### **Quartet Finals and the Show of Champions**



**Steve Kirsch** coolly emceed the **Quartet Finals** and the **Show of Champions** which featured our new chorus champions, **Parkside Harmony** (also 2022 BHS 4<sup>th</sup> Place Chorus Medalists), and the **Alexandria Harmonizers** (2022 BHS 3<sup>rd</sup> Place Chorus Medalists).

Our 2020 M-AD Quartet Champs, **Pratt Street Power (Ed Schubel, Darren Schmidt, Ben** 

Hawker, and Vince Sandroni), had waited 2 additional years for their swansong set only be dashed by a last-minute vocal illness. However, they quickly recruited a highly qualified fill-in lead, Melody Hine (2019 Harmony Inc. Quartet Queen in Hot Pursuit), to form "Pratt Street Melody." They sounded great and the audience expressed their appreciation with cheers and applause.

The MADAQC Chorus met briefly at the intermission. We were well-prepared and our honorary director, Kevin King, needed only to make a few tweaks before we were ready. As we took the stage Steve Kirsch commented on many quartet champs attending the convention and read the names of the quartets they represented. The audience gave each their due applause. He then recognized the always dapper Bob Parry (right) from our 1960 champs, Out-of-Towners, as the oldest quartet represented. Steve also recognized the decade anniversaries of all champion quartets with living members.

As the top 10 quartets huddled backstage, anxiously waiting for the possibility that their names will be called among the top 3 finishers, **Bill Vermue** (Administrative Judge) and **Ig Jakovac** (M-AD President) gave the late-night eval instructions and then announced the contest results. **Pratt Street Power** stood at-the-ready to award the yellow, red, and blue lapel pins and bring out the heavier hardware for the new champions.

As you know, the Barbershop Harmony Society is now "Everyone in Harmony" and open to all who love harmony. This was the first M-AD Fall District Contest where there were numerous qualifying quartets and choruses contained non-male singers. Three all-female quartets earned top 10 honors (pictured below), and one all-female chorus placed 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Others placing in the top 10 were, **Madhattan** in 4<sup>th</sup> Place, **Ovation!** In 6<sup>th</sup> place, **Default Quartet Name** in 7<sup>th</sup> place, and **Age of Flight** in 9<sup>th</sup> place.

**First Take** (3,178 (88.3%) was then crowned **2023 M-AD Quartet Champions** and awarded the traveling **MADAQC/Oriole Four Trophy,** individual **James E. Grant Award** trophies (provided annually by **Bob Disney** in memory of Jim), and 1<sup>st</sup> Place lapel pins. MADAQC badges will be issued later.



**Kevin King** then directed the **MADAQC Chorus** in singing our traditional song of celebration and congratulations, "*This is the Moment*" (arranged by **Freddie King**), as **First Take** stood together pridefully. Kevin then led the entire audience in "*Keep the Whole World Singing*" ... bringing to close another fantastic barbershop convention.



### **Quartet Champs Reception**

Immediately following the close of the convention, we all moved to the backstage area where **Tom and Donna Halley** had set up the traditional **Quartet Champion's Reception**. District President **Ig Jakovac** was there to make some very nice comments about MADAQC's high visibility and contributions throughout the convention. **Steve White** led the toast and welcomed **First Take** into our association of champions and close friends saying, "First Take is now and forever an indelible part of our district's great history of quartet singing."











**Ben Hawker** offered **Pratt Street Power's** hearty congratulations and continued the tradition of offering a legacy gift, this time with a comical theme (pictured below).
